

Using Uizard - Free Plan Instructions

1) Create your free account

1. Go to <https://app.uizard.io/sign-up/> and make an account with your AI Bootcamp email. You will be asked a series of questions once you sign up including the kind of work you do (Education) and your role (Student). For, "How did you hear about Uizard?" you can choose "work/school."
2. When you get to the pricing page, choose the "Continue to Uizard(free)" button in the middle of the \$0 plan. Know your free plan limits so you can plan your project: up to 2 projects, up to 5 screens per project, 10 templates, and about 3 AI generations per month. Free exports are JPG, PNG, or PDF at 1x resolution.

2) Start a project

You can watch the 3 minute tour or just continue. You have three easy starting paths. Pick one.

A) Use a ready-made template (Some templates are locked because they are only for paid plans.)

1. Visit <https://uizard.io/templates/>
2. Click a template to preview, then choose "Use this template." You can scroll through its screens before you decide. [Uizard](#)

B) Generate with AI (Autodesigner)

1. From the Uizard home screen, choose "Generate with Autodesigner."
2. Pick your device type (website desktop, mobile app, tablet).
3. Type a short prompt that says what you want and the format. Example: "A 3-page website for a school club with a home page, events page, and sign-up form."

4. Click Generate, then pick a result you like. Tip: mention “website” or “app” in your prompt so it makes the right format. Free accounts get a small number of AI generations each month, so draft your prompt first. [Uizard Help Center](#)

C) Turn a screenshot into an editable mockup

1. Choose “Screenshot Scanner,” upload a screenshot of a site or app you like, and let Uizard convert it to editable UI. [Uizard](#)

3) Edit your screens

1. You can zoom in on any screen using the option in the top menu just right of the center. Click any text in a screen to rewrite it.
2. Drag buttons, images, and cards from the left sidebar onto the canvas.
3. Add screens with the “+” screen button if you need them, but remember the free plan screen limit. [Uizard](#)

4) Link your screens into a prototype

1. Select a button or image that should move to another screen.
2. Add an interaction to link it to the target screen.
3. Repeat for your main user flow.

5) Preview your prototype

1. Click Preview in the top right to test the clicks just like a real app or site.
2. Try your paths and make quick fixes. [Uizard Help Center](#)

6) Share with your teacher or teammates

1. Use a share link so others can view and comment.
2. Remember that private projects are a paid feature, so do not include personal info in free projects. [Uizard+1](#)

7) Export your work

1. When you are ready to turn it in, export screens as PNG, JPG, or PDF.
2. Free exports are basic 1x resolution. If you need higher resolution or developer handoff, that is a paid feature.

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
